Fee free and funded qualifications in NSW

The NSW government is currently
funding some vocational training:



Apprenticeships and Traineeships

All apprentices and some trainees (new entrant trainees that have been employed for no more than 3 months full time or 12 months part time) are entitled to **fee free training** in NSW, for **all qualifications**.



SBATs

School-based apprenticeships and traineeships are available for **Year 10 and 11 high school students** in NSW undertaking the Higher School Certificate (HSC), allowing them to commence an apprenticeship or complete a traineeship while at school.



ABStudy

ABStudy allowance for Certificate III in On Country Management (up to \$300/week per student)



Federal budget

Some federal subsidies are also available for certain qualifications (**Cert III Parks and Gardens**).
